I am truly grateful for the efforts of this group, which has expanded to 144 alumnae from around the world. In the pages of the 2022–23 Alumnae Legacy Circle Annual Report, you will find highlights from the year that showcase the continued efforts of this remarkable cohort. #### **2022–23 COLLEGE HIGHLIGHTS**



#### NEW UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT

In July 2023, Nemat "Minouche" Shafik became the 20th president of Columbia University, making her the first female president in the University's history. President Shafik is a leading economist whose remarkable career has focused on public policy and academia. Her most recent book, What We Owe Each Other: A New Social Construct, challenges institutions and individuals to rethink how we can better support each other.

#### DEAN SORETT'S FIRST YEAR

This year was **Josef Sorett**'s first as dean of Columbia College. Dean Sorett joined the Columbia faculty in 2009 as a professor in the departments of Religion and African American & African Diaspora Studies. He connected with Columbia College alumni at events throughout the country, including Boston, Miami, San Francisco and Los Angeles. His second book, *Black is a Church: Christianity and the Contours* of (African) American Life was published in March 2023.



### CORE KNOWLEDGE BOOK SERIES

Inspired by the Core Curriculum, the **Core Knowledge Book Series** aims to deliver the intellectual energy and creative thinking of the Core's classes to a wider audience. The series, published by Columbia University Press, acts as a companion to Core courses and is written by faculty from Columbia College and other institutions.

In February, the College hosted more than 100 students, alumni and faculty in Low Library to hear a discussion with professors Elisabeth Ladenson, Gareth Williams and Philip Kitcher, moderated by Dean Josef Sorett.



#### **EXPANSION OF FINANCIAL AID**

During the 2022–23 academic year, Columbia College rolled out several **financial aid enhancements**. Families with typical assets and incomes below \$66,000 are no longer expected to contribute to the cost of their student's education. In addition, students from families with typical assets and incomes up to \$150,000 attend Columbia tuition-free. The College also introduced \$2,000 start-up grants, which are awarded to low-income, first-year students to ease their transition to college.



#### CLASS OF 2027

Columbia College and The Fu Foundation School of Engineering and Applied Science selected the incoming **Class of 2027** from the third-largest-ever applicant pool. 2,246 students were accepted from 57,129 applicants, making this year's overall admission rate 3.9 percent — the second lowest in admissions history. The Class of 2027 hails from all 50 states and 101 countries, highlighting Columbia's ever-expanding global reputation. Approximately half of admitted students were offered need-based financial aid.




#### TRANSFORMATION OF URIS HALL

The Alumnae Legacy Circle is a leadership giving society for Columbia College's most generous alumnae. The ALC has grown to **144 members** since it was established.







#### SUPPORT OF THE COLUMBIA COLLEGE FUND

Members of the Alumnae Legacy Circle generously contributed **\$1.93 million** to the Columbia College Fund during the 2022–23 Fiscal Year. These gifts are current-use — this means the full amount is immediately available to be spent. Donations to the Columbia College Fund can be unrestricted, so they can be used where they are needed most, or directed to the Core Curriculum, financial aid, internships or student life.

#### SUPPORT BEYOND THE COLLEGE FUND

ALC members gave an additional **\$1.39 million** to other areas of Columbia College by supporting various funds, including \$799,000 to endowed scholarship funds. Endowed funds provide Columbia with a reliable source of income in perpetuity. They are invested and the accumulated appreciation and income is used to fund an annual distribution. Combined with the College Fund, this support helps the College meet the needs of students each year.

### ALC MEMBER FEATURE

When reading last year's Alumnae Legacy Circle Annual Report, **Mary O'Donnell Hulme CC'92, SIPA'95** and **Kathryn R. O'Donnell-Schlatter CC'93** were surprised to see each other on the list of new members. The sisters had both joined the ALC in April 2022 without the other's knowledge. Their individual and shared experiences as students inspired them to give back to Columbia College and continue to be meaningful in their relationship with each other.

Mary was the first to choose Columbia, entering as a first-year student in the fall of 1988. Mary and Kathryn's mother was hopeful that Mary would choose Columbia. As someone who grew up in the suburbs, their father was more hesitant of the city environment. After they took her for a campus tour, **she said the environment was "expansive and cozy at the same time."** She felt free to explore all of New York City but she could always rely on the Columbia community as a home base.



Kathryn became interested in exploring Columbia when she saw her older sister's student experience. The following year, Kathryn entered her first year at the College. Both lived in Carman Hall during their first year and valued how diverse their residence hall was at the time. **They noted how this exposed them to new perspectives** and led to robust conversations surrounding the Core Curriculum in and outside of the classroom.

Mary and Kathryn's connection to Columbia didn't end at graduation. When interviewing young women interested in attending Columbia and hearing their stories, in conjunction with the rising cost of a college education, they found themselves motivated to join the ALC. When Kathryn reflects on her time as a student, **she appreciates how the generosity of alumni before her paved a way for many of her peers to attend Columbia** — several of whom she remains friends with today. Mary appreciates the intellectual skills that the Core gave her and seeks to support other women in receiving these skills from the curriculum. Both believe that their philanthropy to the College has deepened their bond to Columbia by connecting them to the needs of current students.

Similarly, their time at the College and in the ALC deepened their relationship with one another. Kathryn says her shared educational experience with her sister "remains foundational" to their relationship. **It has allowed them to explore mutual interests beyond what most siblings share.** Both developed an affinity for art history and Shakespeare after taking classes with Professor Meyer Shapiro. They still like to meet in the city when there is an exhibition that excites them like

Lauren Halsey's Metropolitan Museum Rooftop and the Van Gogh Cypresses exhibits. Mary fondly remembers visiting museums in the city with her Art Humanities Professor, Vidya Dehejia, who taught Indian and Islamic Art at the time. This class gave both sisters a new lens through which to explore art that anchors their relationship in many ways today.

When Mary was asked what being a part of the ALC means to her, she said that, "**Columbia has given me so much.** I want to support the next generation of students and for them to have the same benefits that I received from my Columbia experience. Those benefits ranged from having intellectual conversations to making lifelong friends to spending time in New York City."

Similarly, Kathryn recalled reading the student biographies from scholarship recipients in last year's Alumnae Legacy Circle Annual Report and feeling "so proud and impressed" with her alma mater. She said, "reading about these students is really inspiring! I want to continue to support this because we should invest in the talent that we have when it is impactful and makes a difference in their lives and our community. It's the students who are inspiring. I was reading [the Annual Report] thinking 'Oh my goodness, **these students are incredible!**' It's hard for that [feeling] to not be infectious — and you want to participate in that."


