

Upcoming from the **Holder Initiative**: *American Voter Project – 2020 Election Debrief* 

With the impact of the pandemic, voters' uncertainty around mail-in ballots, and anticipated litigation delaying the announcement of the results, this election is like none before. Join the latest installment of the American Voter Project on Thursday, November 5, that will feature in-depth post-election analysis with Eric H. Holder Jr. CC'73, LAW'76, 82nd Attorney General of the United States; Neal Katyal, Former Acting Solicitor General of the United States; and Donna Brazile, Former Interim Chair of the Democratic National Committee. For the twelfth installment of the American Voter Project series, the Holder Initiative hosted a spirited discussion panel on October 8 about the upcoming election, featuring Holder, Vanita Gupta (The Leadership Conference on Civil and Human Rights), Eugene Robinson (The Washington Post), and Nate Silver (FiveThirtyEight). On October 3, the Holder Initiative hosted a TED Talk-styled showcase about racial justice in the United States, featuring Columbia alumni, students, faculty, and friends. Watch the "Racial Justice Lightning Talks" video here.

Undergraduate Research and Fellowships successfully held the first annual Research Week from October 19–23, to promote, celebrate and demystify undergraduate research on campus. Undergraduate students were invited to participate in workshops to explore research opportunities on and off campus; interested students received advice on how to start their journey as undergraduate researchers, and advanced students explored possibilities for pursuing research in a post-graduate context. Students also had a chance to connect with graduate students and alumni across the disciplines, to hear how they became interested in their field and how that pursuit has changed them.

The week culminated with the annual Undergraduate Research Symposium, which took place during Family Days 2020. Over 130 students presented their work virtually through poster and video presentations; we were inspired to see the resourcefulness of our students who, despite the many challenges facing them during the pandemic, participated in innovative remote research over the summer, and presented their findings. Abstracts from the Symposium will be posted here shortly.
