

What's Happening

Get program updates from teams and units and news about on-campus developments

As part of the new **Test Lion Test** compliance campaign, we have created an incentive program to promote positive reinforcement. We are already seeing very high levels of compliance this term and will continue to reinforce messaging and

measures in order to maintain this encouraging response rate. Starting this week, students who complete their twice-weekly testing will be entered into a lottery for prizes; we'll also be creating "Take Good Care" packages for students who need to isolate or quarantine.

Spring 2021 Covid-Related Emergency Grant: College and Engineering undergraduates enrolled in the spring term who have experienced challenges finding paid work to support their necessary expenses were eligible to apply for a one-time emergency grant. This unique grant opportunity was funded by the CARES Act Higher Education Emergency Relief Funds, for aided students who are eligible for U.S. federal financial aid programs. Other students who receive financial aid were able to apply for a similar emergency grant funded by Columbia College and Columbia Engineering. The final review of applications and notification of awards was completed this week.

Room Selection 2021: On-campus housing selection for the 2021-22 academic year starts this Monday, February 15. The Columbia Housing website provides helpful information and tools to help guide students through the process; students may also be directed to additional tools like these video resources (that include How Room Selection Works, Picking as a Group and Room Selection for Sophomores) as well as virtual information sessions for rising seniors, rising juniors or rising sophomores.

Did you know?

Any unused funds in your 2020 Healthcare and/or Dependent Care flexible spending account (FSA) will automatically roll over into 2021. Additionally, the Dependent Care FSA eligibility age has increased temporarily from 13 to 14 for 2020 funds, for use in 2021. These changes are included in the December Covid-19 Stimulus Bill, which allows employers flexibility in the administration of 2020 and 2021 FSAs. In the coming weeks you will have the opportunity to adjust your 2021 FSA contributions during a special enrollment window.
