

Guidelines for Columbia College Students

General Guidelines

All Columbia College students planning to take Summer Session courses should consult the *2020-2021 Columbia College Bulletin*: <http://bulletin.columbia.edu/columbia-college/regulations/#studyoutsidecolumbiacollegertext>

- There is a 16-point limit for the entire Summer Session, with no more than 8 points in any Summer Session period or in overlapping periods.
- Points for courses taken for R credit may not be used toward the 124 points required for the degree.
- Generally, students may not take Summer Session courses for Pass/D/Fail, except in certain situations, detailed in the *2020-2021 Columbia College Bulletin* at the link noted above.
- Not all courses offered in the Summer Session are accepted by Columbia College for credit. The following courses are **not approved** for Columbia College credit:
