Summer 2021: Check out the College's Our Path Forward (OPF) for updates about the summer term. Students were sent emails about course registration and housing within the last week. Continue to check the page as more information becomes available about financial aid, billing and other topics, and as new FAQs are developed.

We will continue to work under lower campus density requirements through the summer term. Housing capacity will be limited, but will be open to students with guaranteed housing who are registered full-time with a minimum of 6 credits for a summer session. Priority will be given to class standing, and to students who require campus facilities and housing in order to succeed academically. If space permits, summer housing may be available to students who are not registered full-time and/or have an on-campus job or research opportunity.

Reflections on the past year: Covid-19 changed Columbia College operations in ways we never imagined. One year ago, most of us thought we might work from home for a few weeks to "flatten the curve," but we soon learned that the pandemic would change so much more about our lives. We invite you to share your reflections and experiences of the past year using this form; we will share some answers in the next edition of TFF.

Did you know? This week's Vaccine Update Forum announced that Columbia faculty, staff and students who are eligible based on NYS criteria can get vaccinated at four Columbia-operated locations (including Lerner Hall) that will be open by the end of this month.
